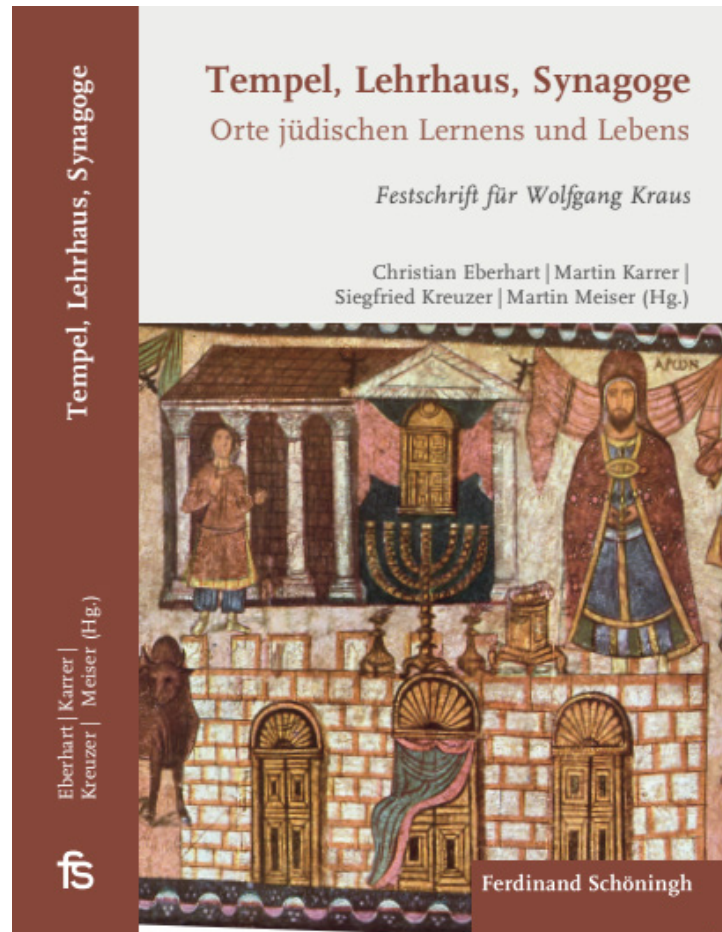
RELS Lunch and Learns
