The CFTG is open to all master's, doctorate, and professional students. Applications are due **October 2, 2023.**

Writing an Effective Teaching Philosophy Statement (Virtual): Are you applying for academic jobs? Learn about writing a teaching statement that reflects your teaching beliefs and experiences. Participants will learn how to get started drafting a teaching statement, which is often required for US academic job applications.
