ACADEMIC PROGRAMS AND DEGREE REQUIREMENTS

MASTER OF SCIENCE IN NURSING

The Master of Science in Nursing (MSN) program is designed to build upon the BSN degree. Students in the MSN program are prepared to function at advanced levels with an expanded knowledge of theory, research, population health, and clinical application. Graduates are prepared to provide evidence-based health care and to work in interdisciplinary teams. Each graduate will be prepared to function in their chosen advanced practice role. Family Nurse Practitioner students are educationally prepared to sit for national certification through the American Academy of Nurse Practitioners Certification Board (AANPCB) or the American Nurses Credentialing Center (ANCC).




MASTER OF SCIENCE IN NURSING ACADEMIC PROGRAMS

The Master of Science in Nursing program prepares professional nurses for leadership roles in nursing. Graduate study in nursing requires the acquisition and systematic application of knowledge and skills in nursing practice, evidence-based practice, and a nursing role. Innovative educational delivery and part-time study is available for the Nurse Administration, Nurse Education, and Family Nurse Practitioner tracks.

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MASTER OF SCIENCE IN NURSING PROGRAM GOALS (OUTCOMES)

- 1. Assume advanced leadership roles in a variety of health care settings.
- 2. Exemplify ethical, legal, and professional standards for advanced nursing practice.
- 3. Integrate advanced knowledge of nursing and related disciplines in the roles of educator, administrator, or clinician.
- 4. Participate in research and other scholarly activities to expand nursing knowledge.
- 5. Work effectively in interdisciplinary relationships or partnerships to promote, maintain, and restore the health of clients; improve health care delivery systems; shape health policy; or influence professional education.



POST MASTER'S OF SCIENCE IN NURSING DOCTOR OF NURSING PRACTICE

The Post Master's Doctor of Nursing Practice (DNP) program is designed to build upon the existing MSN program at UH. The CON DNP has a practice focus--a post master's program educating in evidence-based practice, quality improvement, and systems leadership.

The DNP program is offered in a hybrid model utilizing both online and face-to-face modalities two days per term at the University of Houston campus. Additionally, clinical experiences will be available face-to-face in the community setting.



DOCTOR OF SCIENCE IN NURSING PRACTICE ACADEMIC PROGRAMS

The DNP program is a part-time post master's program designed for working nurses. Students may chose to enroll in one of two tracks: (1) the <u>Post-Master's Administrative</u>, or (2) the <u>Post-Master's Family Nurse Practitioner Track</u>.

DOCTOR OF NURSING PRACTICE PROGRAM GOALS (OUTCOMES)

- 1. Perform at the highest level of advanced nursing practice, providing expanded health care access to individuals, families, populations, and communities.
- 2. Incorporate leadership and interprofessional collaboration skills to deliver safe, effective, comprehensive, cost-effective care.
- 3. Develop, implement, and evaluate innovative programs in the areas of patient care, population health, leadership, education, and policy.
- 4. Enhance nursing education in nursing programs through evidence-based knowledge, research, ethical standards, technology, and clinical judgment to advance quality of care and health concerns.
- 5. Guide change in health care policies and systems.
- 6. Demonstrate achievement of DNP nationally recognized essentials and competencies.

Graduates of a DNP program must achieve 1000 clinical hours from a combination of clinical hours in a master's program and the DNP program. Each student will achieve a minimum of 500 clinical hours in the CON DNP program. To ensure students meet the required minimum 1000 clinical hours, students with an MSN degree that did not include 500 clinical hours must have a portfolio review to determine an action plan for achieving the required clinical hours. A plan will be developed to achieve any additional hours required. The portfolio may include a written description of the individual's practice experience, participation in academic and specialized programs in the specialty area, national certification in specialty area, and/or additional activities and experiences that exemplify expert practice in nursing and healthcare leadership. The clinical hours accepted to meet the 500-hour requirement at the master's level must be outside the individual's normal scope of paid employment.

DEGREE REQUIREMENTS

REQUIREMENTS FOR MSN AND DNP PROGRAM ADMISSION

Applicants to the graduate nursing programs must meet all requirements for graduate admission as described in the <u>UH Catalog</u>, on the <u>CON MSN website Requirements Page</u> and on the <u>CON DNP website Requirements Page</u>.

The number of MSN students admitted each year is determined by availability of appropriate qualified faculty and/or clinical resources. Applicants are reviewed on an individual basis.


