



Transportation

The best way to get around Houston is in your personal vehicle. There is public transportation; however, being the fourth largest city in the U.S. and the expansive nature of the city, public transportation takes some maneuvering. Take time to explore traffic, distances, and bus/rail routes to determine the best mode of transportation for you. Houston also has high occupancy vehicle (HOV+2) lanes and toll roads. Depending on traffic, a 10-mile commute can take more than 30 minutes. Traffic in Houston is bi-directional; traffic times in and out of the city are the same.
